



In cities the future emerges. Cities and urban areas are both generators of innovation and progress and hotspots of societal problems. Just as society changes continuously, cities do too. Cities are never complete. Changing structural, spatial, social, economic, ecological and legal requirements need to be taken into account in order to adapt cities and urban areas to new challenges – in a constant interplay of theory, practice and research.

The Urban Planning study programme at HCU Hamburg positions itself in this complex sphere: Through interdisciplinary exchange, we work on new solutions, visions and projects that promote sustainability and can serve to develop future-proof cities and urban areas.

A notable feature of both study programmes (Bachelor and Master) are the studio projects. These projects are the centerpiece of Urban Planning education. Together, three to twelve students develop concepts, strategies and solutions in response to current problems and questions from day-to-day planning practice. This encourages the application of acquired skills and knowledge and promotes collaborative skills.


