02 Stay Organized

In „ahoi“ you register for courses and exams, and you can get an overview of your grades. This way, you are always informed about the current status of your academic progress. Our tip: Check it regularly!

05 Ask + Stay Informed

Use available resources like the HCU website to stay informed. Ask questions at the information desk or Student Service. Make use of office hours. Write clear and concise emails, and be precise with your requests.

08 Stay Motivated

The greatest motivation comes from within. Find exciting topics in your field. What excites you? Where do you want to go? How can you shape the future with your knowledge?

03 Plan Your Studies

Plan ahead and create your individual schedule, taking into account your interests and commitments. Use the teaching and exam schedules of your courses. Exchange ideas with fellow students to plan more effectively together.

06 Take Responsibility

You are responsible for your own studies. Things can go wrong sometimes—own your mistakes and work together to find solutions.

09 Show Engagement

By participating in interdisciplinary university committees such as the Student Parliament (StuPa), the General Students' Committee (ASTA), or the Senate, and by getting involved in your study program through the student councils (FSR), you can help shape the university and your studies.

01 Know the Rules

In the examination regulations (ASPO, BPSO), as well as in the module plan and module descriptions of your degree program, you will find all the rules for your studies. For example, important (submission) deadlines and requirements for your exams.

04 Read Emails

By enrolling, you have committed to reading the emails in your HCU email inbox. This is where you receive important information about your studies and from the university. Don't miss anything!

07 Stay Curious

Studying means learning: Attend lectures, exercises, and tutorials. Think outside the box—participate in extra-curricular events, excursions, and talks. Get to know the working world.

10 Build Your Network

Network with your fellow students. Form study groups, help each other out, and enjoy breaks together. Reach out to students from other fields and universities. Together, you are strong. Good luck!

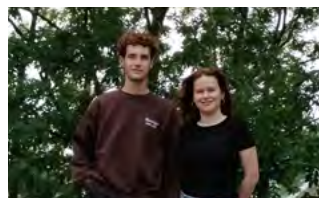
The General Student Committee

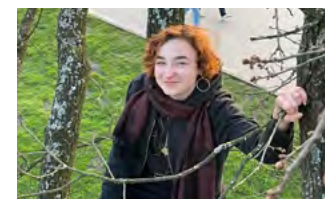
Campus Culture: Mira and Nico

Ahoi

At HafenCity University, ahoi stands not only for the maritime greeting, but also for “General University Organization and Information System” (In German the abbreviation makes sense). This is where you already applied for your studies and where you also register for seminars, lectures and exams. During the first days of the New Student Orientation, there will be special ahoi introductions for you. There, ahoi tutors will explain to you how to structure and organize your studies via ahoi.

Library

FaSt

ENo matter which degree program you start at HCU, you will always encounter the interdisciplinary study programs (FaSt). The goal is for you to take courses within the framework of FaSt that allow you to look beyond your own field and gain completely different perspectives.

How this works in detail will be explained to you during the New Student Orientation.



Construction Laboratories

In the basement, you will find excellently equipped laboratories with numerous testing machines, experimental equipment and a wide variety of analytical devices, as well as an extensive collection of construction materials.

In the programs of architecture and civil engineering many practical exercises take place here.

Print, Scan and Copy

Multifunction printers are available for students on the 1st and 2nd floor south, as well as in the library.

For printing and copying you have to charge your HCU-Card with credit at the terminal on the ground floor.

HCU-Card

The electronic chip card simplifies a variety of everyday tasks for you.

Among other things, the card can be used as an ID card, as a library card, for printing, copying and scanning, as a semester ticket and as a means of payment for printing or in the cafeteria.

To charge your credit, there are two terminals behind the stairs on the ground floor and in the cafeteria.



International Office

You would like to do a semester abroad or are interested in an internship abroad? Then the International Office can help you. Märchenwelten

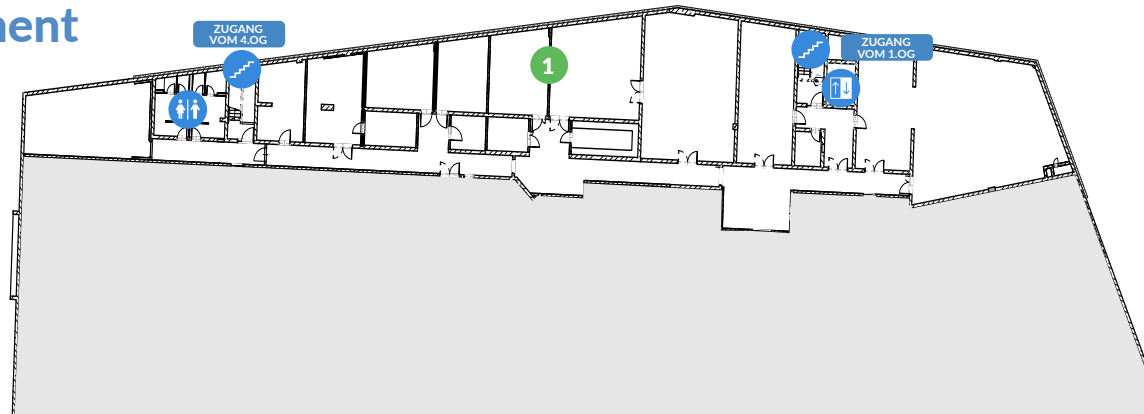

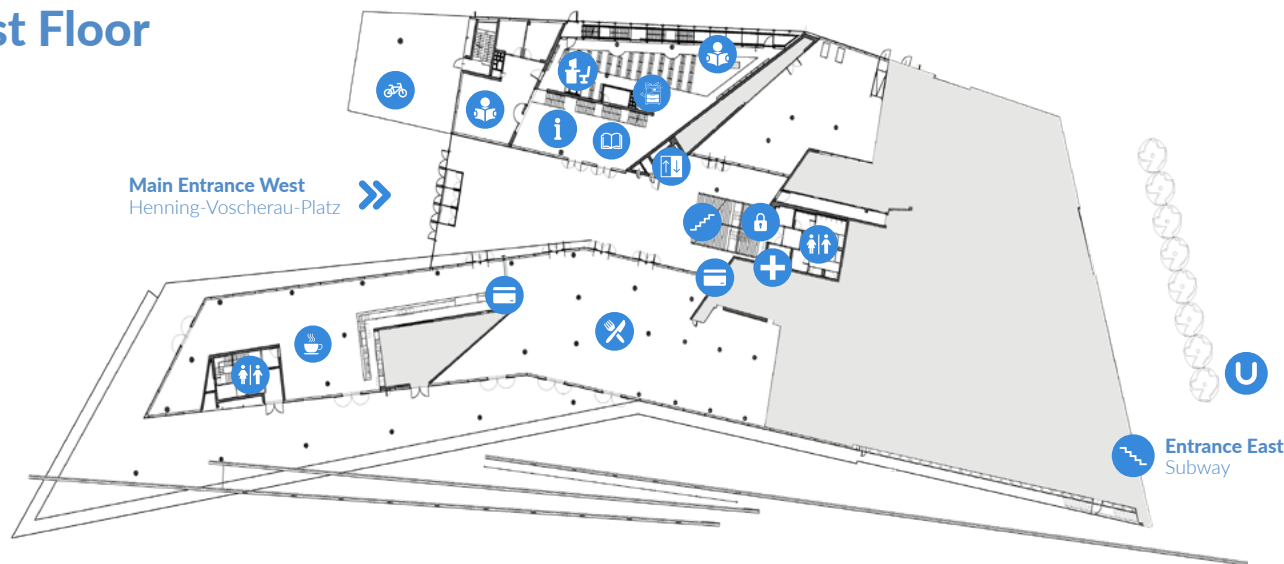
Elbarkaden

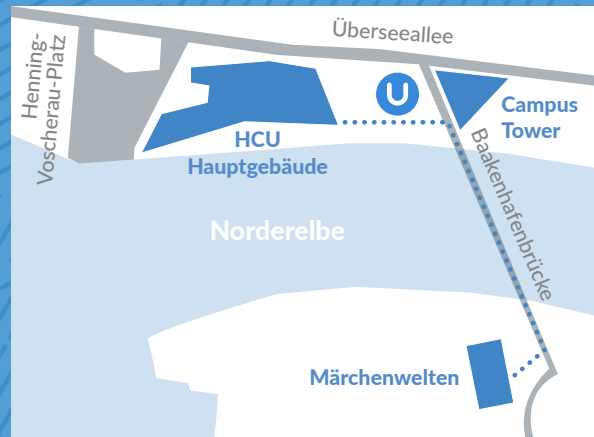
